From the Principal

Second semester begins on January 20th, and our Guidance Department is in full swing developing student schedules for the 2011-2012 school year. It is vital that parents discuss student class selections with their children. Elective courses are scheduled based on student requests. If students do not select certain electives, those classes will be eliminated from the master schedule due to lack of interest. There are four new courses that will be offered this year in Bedford County. AP Psychology and Engineering Exploration are based at JF while the new Robotics and Leadership through Internship are offered at BSTC. The BSTC courses are available to juniors or seniors. If you have questions related to any courses, please contact your child's guidance counselor.

The high school start time will be changed for the 2011-2012 school year. The Bedford County School Board will make a final decision on this schedule change in February. The two options are to start the high/middle school at 7:55 A.M. and end at 2:35 P.M. or to begin the day at 8:55 A.M. and conclude at 3:35 P.M. At the January school board meeting, much discussion centered on the later starting time for the high/middle school. While no decision has been made, the high school principals recommended an 8:55 A.M.-3:35 P.M. school day. Once a decision is made, we will post this information on the website along with the start time for zero period.

The spring offers many great events including the Ring Dance, Prom/After Prom, and graduation. I look forward to the experiences these events offer our students.

Bedford County Public School's Policy on Graduation Ceremony and Class Rank

For graduation ceremony purposes, students with a 3.75 to 3.99 GPA will be recognized as Honor Graduates. Students with a GPA of 4.0 and above will be recognized as High Honor Graduates. The GPA for Honor and High Honor Graduates will be determined based on the student's entire course history. All graduation honors are based on the student's GPA at the end of the third-nine week period of the senior year. Beginning with the class of 2011, the practice of determining a Valedictorian and Salutatorian for graduation purposes has been discontinued. Graduation ceremonies will be conducted by students selected from the High Honors group as determined by High Honors and Honor students. An official class ranking, based on a student's entire course history, will appear on the final senior transcript.

The JF Gifted Education Program has enrolled eleven new participants as a result of the first semester screening. We are delighted to be able to recognize these exceptionally academically talented students, and hope that they—along with all other academically strong JF students – will take advantage of the challenging courses, extra-curricular activities and summer programs available to them. (Spring testing for TAG nominees begins in February.)

Three particularly interesting opportunities (open to all students –not just TAG--who meet the requirements of the particular program) have come to my attention lately:

- The Society of Women Engineers at the University of Virginia would like to extend an invitation to female juniors and seniors to spend a weekend exploring majors and careers in engineering. Another opportunity for learning can be found online at the Khan Academy. This is a nonprofit program which offers instruction in just about every academic subject you can think of from elementary school through first year college. It was originally designed to provide instruction for students around the world who do not have access to a quality education and is available in many different languages. You can find short (15 minute) video lessons on just about every topic in any course offered from the primary grades through calculus. I checked out a few math presentations from algebra and calculus and found them very easy to follow. You select the subject area, the course, and then the topic. This is a great resource for students who are absent or just need a little extra help and explanation, and might also prove helpful for parents who are “tutoring.”

Take advantage of the great *AP courses* that we offer here at JF! If you have any questions, please contact your child's guidance counselor.

Why should your child enroll in an AP course?

Gain the Edge in College Preparation

- **Registration for AP exams** will begin in February, 2011. The cost is \$87 per exam. More information on the procedure to register will be posted on the JF webpage under Guidance starting February 1, 2011.

- Those students in **AP math, science and English courses do not need to register**. Their exam fees will be covered by the AP Grant that Bedford County received through the Virginia Advanced Study Strategies and the National Math and Science Initiative.

Why should your child enroll in Dual Enrollment courses?

- ✓ Earn College Credit! Colleges in the state of Virginia readily accept dual enrollment college credits.
 - ✓ Earn college credit with friends! In the comfort of a JF classroom with a teacher your child already knows. (College Pre-Calculus and College English.)
 - ✓ Earn college credit at the local CVCC campus! Your child will learn in a small sized class and avoid those 300 student freshman classes at four-year schools.
 - ✓ Earn college credit based on your child's entire semester of assignments, tests, and quizzes.
 - ✓ Earn weighted credit at JF! If our child takes college courses such as English, math, history and science they will earn weighted credit at JF.
 - ✓ Why pay more for the **same** college credits? CVCC tuition is affordable and considerably less than the four-year schools.
 - ✓ Be prepared for your college acceptance letter! You will already have a college transcript to include with your college application!
 - ✓ Get a jump start! It is possible to complete all college freshman course-work while a senior at JF, eliminating the fight for the few freshman slots available at the college your child wants to attend.
- Students who plan to take **dual-enrollment classes at CVCC** next year should make an appointment to meet with Mrs. Lowry or their guidance counselors **prior to March 31st**. At this time they will obtain the necessary paperwork to enroll at **CVCC on April 8th**. Students will need to take the CVCC placement tests. If students enroll in classes at CVCC that conflict with their selected courses at JFHS, they will need to change their CVCC classes as we will not be able to change the master schedule of when classes are offered at JF. We encourage students to register for classes in the early morning or afternoon/evening at CVCC to minimize scheduling conflicts.
 - Students may go to the CVCC Lynchburg campus to take the English and math **placement tests**. The walk-in testing hours are Monday – Thursday 8:00am – 5:00pm and Friday 8:00am – 3:00pm. The cost is \$7 for both sections. Please take a picture ID and your CVCC student ID number with you. You may obtain a CVCC student ID number by applying for admission online at <http://apply.vccs.edu>.
 - The CVCC **placement tests** will also be administered at **JFHS February 16th, 18th, 23rd and 25th**. Please sign up in guidance with Mrs. Lowry or Mrs. Belden.
 - **CVCC is hosting a Financial Aid “Super Saturday” on Saturday, February 5th** at the Lynchburg Campus from 10:00am – noon. Students who plan to attend college should bring their 2010 tax return and their parent or guardian's tax return and proof of any 2010 untaxed income. The CVCC staff will help you complete and submit your online FAFSA form. This is a **free service** to all students, not just those

applying to CVCC.

- Students will be able to obtain a paper copy of the **2011-2012 FAFSA** by calling the Federal Student Aid Information Center at 1-800-4Fed-Aid (1-800-433-3243) or by visiting www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students may request up to three copies of the paper application and should receive their FAFSA in three to seven business days. We encourage all college-bound students to complete this free application for federal financial aid. It is recommended that you submit your application as early as possible.
- For those students interested in taking the **SAT's** they are being offered on **March 12th** at JFHS, **May 7th** at VES and **June 4th** at LHS and ECglass. Please check the website at www.collegeboard.com for registration information and deadlines.
- An **SAT Prep class** is being offered by CVCC on **Saturday, February 19th and 26th** from 8:00am – 5:00pm (*students must attend both sessions*). The cost is \$89.00 and students must pre-register by calling 832-7607.
- 11th grade students interested in **Boys State or Girls State** should contact Meg Watson in the guidance office.
- **Scholarships** are updated weekly and are posted on the JF website under Guidance. Scholarship listings are posted in the guidance office and in Government classes. Please contact Sally Baum or Mrs. Belden if you have any questions.

Behind-the-Wheel and Driver Education Information

OFFICE LOCATION: Between C&D Hallways in R379

OFFICE HOURS: M-F 8:00-8:26, Monday-1st lunch, Tuesday-2nd lunch, Wednesday-3rd lunch, Thursday/Friday-by appointment.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR BTW: Student has completed 36 hours state approved Driver Education course and holds a learners permit.

IF YOU HAVE TAKEN THE LEARNERS EXAM 3 TIMES AND NOT PASSED, please see Ms. McCoy for information.

SENIORS/JUNIORS: You may sign up anytime during school hours at my office in R379, between C&D Hallways, beginning the first week of school. Students will go according to birthdates and will be notified by a note through a classroom teacher to come and see Ms. McCoy in her office to obtain the necessary paperwork for your Behind the Wheel group. **NO ONE IS IN A GROUP UNTIL ALL PAPERWORK & MONEY IS RETURNED TO MS. MCCOY IN PERSON.**

BEHIND THE WHEEL: We go once every third week, as we share the range with the other 2 county schools and only 10 students go at a time. A bus will take the students to BSTC right after school and will return to JFHS by 6:00. The cost is \$100; it is after school, not on weekends or holidays. The students will drive on the range 4 days and on the road 3. Students must have completed the Driver Education course and hold a learners permit.

SOPHOMORES: Will take the 36-hour Driver Ed course during first semester. Upon completion of the course, students will be issued classroom completion certificates (green cards). If they wish to go privately, or if they are eligible for their licenses, and hold learners, they may sign up and be placed on the waiting list for spring Behind the Wheel. **PLEASE UNDERSTAND, BEING SIGNED UP FOR SPRING BEHIND THE WHEEL IS NOT THE SAME AS SUMMER BEHIND THE WHEEL.** There will be another sign up for summer Behind the Wheel after Spring Break. You **ARE NOT** in a group unless you have received and returned the paperwork. A new sign-up sheet is made for the summer, because of scheduling conflicts for those who have already signed up, or they have signed up but since have gone privately, so this allows for a more updated list.

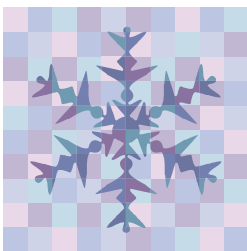

TRANSFER STUDENTS: Must have a classroom completion card/green card in order to take Behind the Wheel. Please obtain from the school where you took the course.

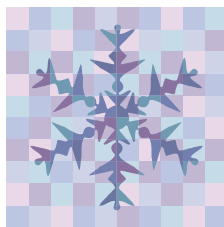
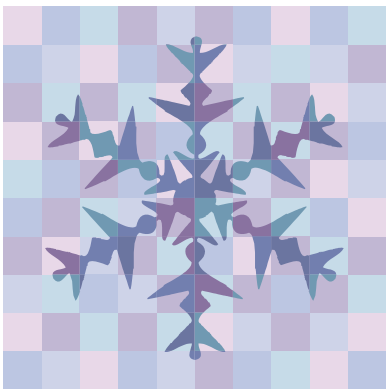
CERTIFIED ONLINE COURSE: www.vadriveredu.org; approximate cost-\$145.

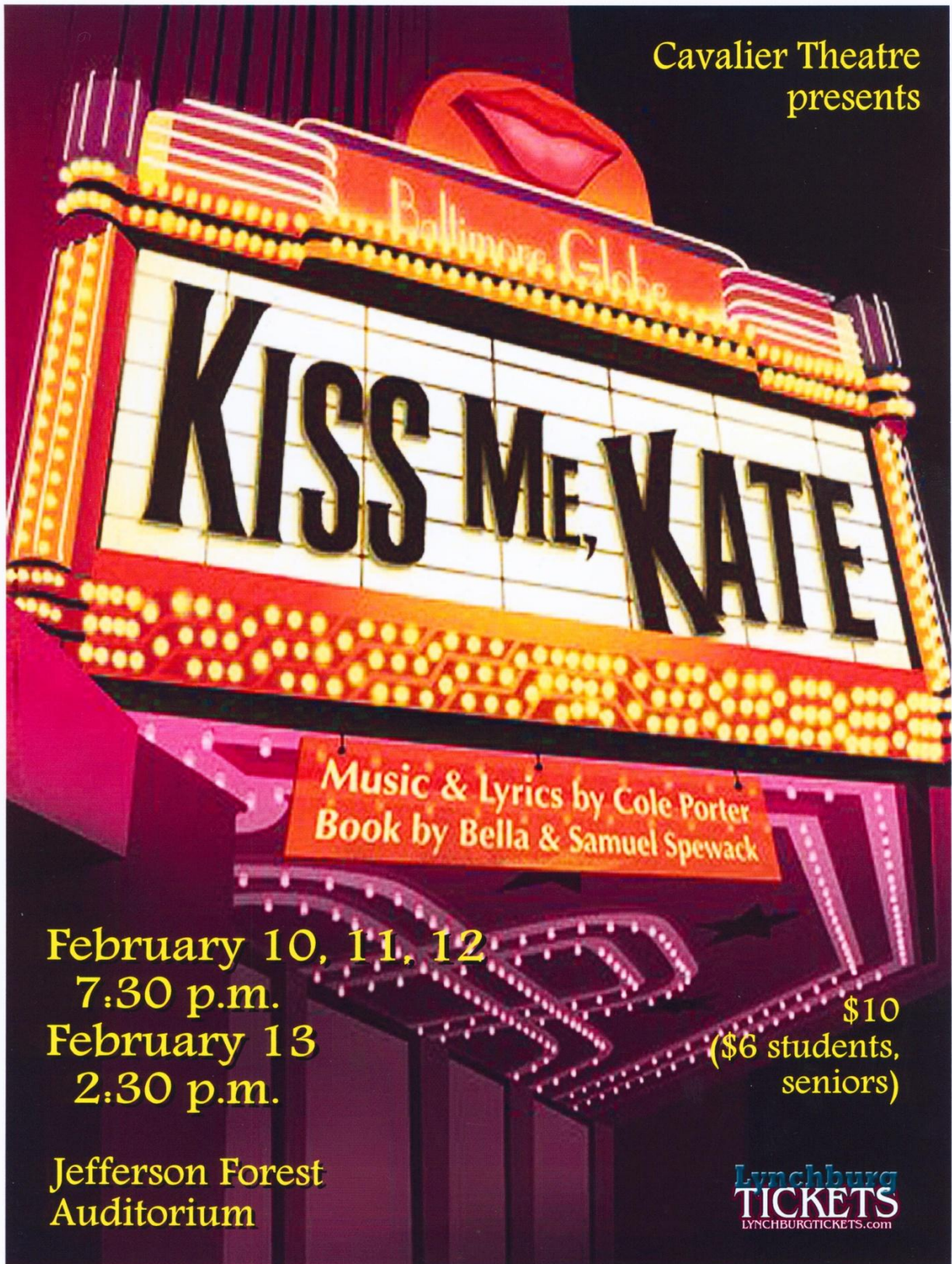
